Featured Saint: Martyr Peter the Aleut



Saint Peter the Aleut is commemorated today,
September 24th. Saint Peter was an Aleutian
from Kodiak, Alaska, who lived at the same
time as Saint Herman of Alaska. Saint Peter
was arrested by Spanish Jesuits in
California, who tortured and killed him for
refusing to convert to Catholicism. Saint
Peter and his companion repeatedly stated to
the Spaniards during their torture, "We are
Christians and we will not change our Faith."
When Saint Peter's companion (who survived

the torture) told Saint Herman about the Aleut's torture and martyrdom, Father Herman said, "Holy New Martyr Peter, Pray to God for Us!".

Orthodox churches around the world: Kyiv Pechersk Lavra in Kyiv,
Ukraine





The Kyiv Pechersk Lavra also known as the Kyiv Monastery of the Caves, is a historic Orthodox Christian monastery located in Kyiv, Ukraine, and is one of the holiest places in the country. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and was named one of the Seven Wonders of Ukraine. The monastery is considered a separate national historic-cultural preserve.

The Greek St. Antony founded this monastery in 1051 after Orthodoxy was adopted as Kyivan Rus' official religion. The Dormition Cathedral was built from 1073 to 1089. It was destroyed by the Tatars in 1240 and went through disastrous fires before being mostly rebuilt in the 18th century. Now the upper monastery is run as a museum while the lower monastery contains cave complexes. The sight has now become a tourist and pilgrim site.

Holy Day: The Feast of the Protection of the Most Holy Theotokos

What is the Feast of the Protection of the Most Holy Theotokos?



Commemorated on October 1st, the Feast of the Protection of the Most Holy Theotokos commemorates the appearance of the Mother of God in the mid-tenth century in Constantinople. During an all-night vigil the Fool for Christ Andrew and several others witnessed the Theotokos descend to the bishop's throne. She prayed for Christians for a period of time, and then took her veil and spread it over the people praying in the church, saying "O Heavenly King, accept all those who pray to You and call on my name for help. Do not let

them go away from my icon unheard."

On the Feast of the Protection of the Most Holy Theotokos we pray: "Remember us in your prayers, O Lady Virgin Mother of God, that we not perish by the increase of our sins. Protect us from every evil and from grievous woes, for in you do we hope, and venerating the Feast of your Protection, we magnify you."
