Readings

Reader: The Reading from Exodus.

[Composite 6: from Exodus 12,13; Numbers 8; Leviticus 12]

And it came to pass, in that day that the Lord brought out the children of Israel from the land of Egypt with their forces, that the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, Sanctify to me every first-born, first produced, opening every womb among the children of Israel both of man and beast: it is Mine.

And Moses said to the people, Remember this day, in which ye came forth out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage, for with a strong hand the Lord brought you forth thence; and you shall keep His law. And it shall come to pass when the Lord thy God shall bring thee into the land of the Canaanites, as he sware to thy fathers, that thou shalt set apart every offspring opening the womb, the males to the Lord.

And if thy son should ask thee hereafter, saying, What is this? then thou shalt say to him, With a strong hand the Lord brought us out of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. And when Pharaoh hardened his heart so as not to send us away, he slew every first-born in the land of Egypt, both the first-born of man and the first-born of beast; therefore do I sacrifice every offspring that opens the womb, the males to the Lord, and every first-born of my sons I will redeem.

And it shall be for a sign, immovable before thine eyes. For thus saith the Lord God Almighty: The first-born of thy sons thou shalt give to me. Whatsoever woman shall have conceived and born a male child, on the eighth day she shall circumcise the flesh of his foreskin. And for thirty-three days she shall not enter the sanctuary of God to the priest, until the days of her purification be fulfilled. And after this, she shall bring a lamb of a year old without blemish for a whole-burnt-offering, and a young pigeon or turtle-dove, to the door of the tabernacle of witness, to the priest. Or, instead of these she shall bring before the Lord two turtle-doves or two young pigeons, and the priest shall pray for her.

For these are given to Me as a recompense out of the midst of the children of Israel: I have taken them and consecrated them to myself instead of all the first-born of the Egyptians, in the day in which I smote every first-born in the land of Egypt, both man and cattle. Thus saith God Most High, the Holy One of Israel.

Reader: The Reading from the Prophecy of Isaiah.

[Isaiah 6:1-12]

And it came to pass in the year in which king Uzziah died, that I saw the Lord sitting on a high and exalted throne, and the house was full of his glory. And seraphs stood round about him: each one had six wings: and with two they covered their face, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one cried to the other, and they said, Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord of hosts: the whole earth is full of his glory.

And the lintel shook at the voice they uttered, and the house was filled with smoke. And I said, Woe is me, for I am pricked to the heart; for being a man, and having unclean lips, I dwell in the midst of a people having unclean lips; and I have seen with mine eyes the King, the Lord of hosts.

And there was sent to me one of the seraphs, and he had in his hand a coal, which he had taken off the altar with the tongs: and he touched my mouth, and said, Behold, this has touched thy lips, and will take away thine iniquities, and will purge off thy sins. And I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go to this people? And I said, Behold, I am here, send me.

And he said, Go, and say to this people, Ye shall hear indeed, but ye shall not understand; and ye shall see indeed, but ye shall not perceive. For the heart of this people has become gross, and their ears are dull of hearing, and their eyes have they closed; lest they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and be converted, and I should heal them.

And I said, How long, O Lord? And he said, Until the cities be deserted by reason of their not being inhabited, and the houses by reason of there being no men, and the land shall be left desolate. And after this God shall remove the men far off, and they that are left upon the land shall be multiplied.

Reader: The Reading from the Prophecy of Isaiah.

[Composite 7: from Isaiah 19]

Behold, the Lord sits on a swift cloud, and shall come to Egypt: and the idols of Egypt shall be moved at his presence, and their heart shall faint within them. And the spirit of the Egyptians shall be troubled within them; and I will frustrate their counsel: And I will deliver Egypt into the hands of cruel lords; thus saith the Lord of hosts.

And the Egyptians shall drink the water that is by the sea, but the river shall fail, and be dried up. Thus saith the Lord: Where are now thy wise men? and let them declare to thee, and say, What has the Lord of hosts purposed upon Egypt? In that day the Egyptians shall be as women, in fear and in trembling because of the hand of the Lord of hosts, which he shall bring upon them.

Aposticha

Tone 7 (for the Feast)

People: Adorn thy bridal chamber, O Zion, and welcome Christ the King! Salute Mary, the heavenly gate, fashioned as the throne of the Cherubim! She carries the King of Glory! The Virgin is a cloud of light: she has borne in the flesh the Son begotten before the Morning Star. Simeon, taking Him in his arms, proclaimed to the peoples: "He is the Master of life and death; the

Savior of the world!"

Reader: Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace, according to Thy word, for mine eyes have seen Thy salvation!

People: The unwedded Mother has brought into the Temple Him Who shone forth before the ages from the Father. In these latter times He was born from a Virgin womb. He gave the Law on Mount Sinai, yet He makes Himself obedient to the commandment of the Law. She has brought Him to the Priest and righteous Elder whose appointed lot it was to see Christ the Lord. Simeon, receiving Him in his arms, rejoiced greatly and cried aloud: "This is God Who is co-eternal with the Father! He is the Redeemer of our souls!"

Reader: A Light to enlighten the Gentiles, and the glory of Thy people Israel.

People: The Theotokos Mary carried in her arms Him Who is borne aloft upon the chariot of the cherubim, and praised in song by the seraphim. The Giver of the Law, Who fulfills the commandment of the Law, was made flesh of the Unwedded Virgin. She gave Him into the arms of the Priest and Elder. Holding the Life, he asked to be released from life, saying: "Now, Master, let me depart to declare to Adam that I have seen the pre-eternal God and Savior of the world, Who was made a Babe without undergoing change!"

Reader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 (for the Feast)

People:

He Who is borne on high by the Cherubim and praised in hymns by the Seraphim is brought today according to the Law into the holy Temple and rests in the arms of the Elder as on a throne.
