Lord, I Call (Tone 2)

People: Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me! Hear me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me! Receive the voice of my prayer when I call upon Thee. Hear me, O Lord! Let my prayer arise in Thy sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands be an evening sacrifice. Hear me, O Lord!

Reader: Set, O Lord, a watch before my mouth, and a door of enclosure round about my lips. Incline not my heart unto words of evil, to make excuse with excuses in sins. With men that work iniquity; and I will not join with their chosen. The righteous man will chasten me with mercy and reprove me; as for the oil of the sinner, let it not anoint my head. For yet more is my prayer in the presence of their pleasures; swallowed up near by the rock have their judges been. They shall hear my words, for they be sweetened; as a clod of earth is broken upon the earth, so have their bones been scattered nigh unto hades. For unto Thee, O Lord, O Lord, are mine eyes, in Thee have I hoped; take not my soul away. Keep me from the snare which they have laid for me, and from the stumbling-blocks of them that work iniquity. The sinners shall fall into their own net; I am alone until I pass by. With my voice unto the Lord have I cried, with my voice unto the Lord have I made supplication. I will pour out before Him my supplication, mine affliction before Him will I declare. Tone 2 (Resurrection)

Reader: The righteous shall wait patiently for me until Thou shalt reward me.

Reader: Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplication.

People: The Angel proclaimed Thee, the crucified and buried Master. He told the women: "Come, see the place where He lay! He is risen as He said, for He is almighty." We worship Thee, O only immortal One. Have mercy on us, O Christ, the Giver of life!

Reader: If Thou shouldest mark iniquities, O Lord, O Lord, who shall stand? For with Thee there is forgiveness.

Tone 1 (for the Feast)

People: Simeon, tell us, Whom dost thou bear in thine arms, that thou dost rejoice so greatly in the Temple? To Whom dost thou shout and cry aloud: "Now am I set free, for I have seen my Savior?" This is He Who was born of a Virgin; this is God the Word, Who came forth from God, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has saved man. Let us worship Him!

Reader: For Thy name's sake have I patiently waited for Thee, O Lord; my soul hath waited patiently for Thy word, my soul hath hoped in the Lord.

People: Simeon, receive Him Whom Moses once beheld in darkness, granting the Law on Sinai, now that He has become a Babe subject to the Law! This is He Who spoke through the Law. This is He, of Whom the Prophets spoke, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has saved man. Let us worship Him!

Reader: From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch let Israel hope in the Lord.

People: Come, let us also go to meet Christ with divine songs! Let us receive Him Whose salvation Simeon saw! This is He Whom David announced; this is He Who spoke in the Prophets, Who, for our sakes, has taken flesh and Who speaks through the Law. Let us worship Him!

Reader: For with the Lord there is mercy, and with Him is plenteous redemption; and He shall redeem Israel out of all his iniquities.

Tone 1 (St. Parthenius)

People: The great Parthenius, the namesake of virginity, the beacon of Lampsacus, the radiant morning star of miracles, calleth us all together by his memorial, that we who sing hymns to Christ the Savior may keep the spiritual feast.

Reader: O praise the Lord, all ye nations; praise Him, all ye peoples.

People: Thou didst bear God within thyself from childhood by the fire of thy prayers, O all-blessed and wise one. Thou didst burn up legions of demons and didst guide the flock of Lampsacus. Casting down the temples of idols, thou didst renew thyself for God.

Reader: For He hath made His mercy to prevail over us, and the truth of the Lord abideth for ever.

People: The fish that was thrown away, breathless, yet life-giving; the fruit of the barren field and vineyard; the generous rain promised to those who wept, all proclaimed thy wonder. Thy works are wonderful, O celebrant of sacred mysteries. Therefore, pray that we may be saved.

Reader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Tone 1 (for the Feast)

Tone 2 (Resurrection)

People: By the Tree Thou didst destroy the curse of the Tree, O Savior. By Thy

burial Thou didst mortify the majesty of death. Thou hast enlightened our race by Thy Resurrection. O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory to Thee!

Reader: For He has established the world, which shall not be moved!

People: When Thou wast seen nailed to the Cross, O Christ, Thou didst restore the

beauty of Thy creatures. The soldiers showed their inhumanity when they pierced Thy side with a spear. The Hebrews, not knowing Thy power, asked that Thy tomb might be sealed, but through the mercy of Thy compassions, Thou didst accept the tomb and didst rise on the third day! O Lord, glory to
