Lord, I Call (Tone 3)

People: Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me! Hear me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me! Receive the voice of my prayer when I call upon Thee. Hear me, O Lord! Let my prayer arise in Thy sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands be an evening sacrifice. Hear me, O Lord!

Reader: Set, O Lord, a watch before my mouth, and a door of enclosure round about my lips. Incline not my heart unto words of evil, to make excuse with excuses in sins. With men that work iniquity; and I will not join with their chosen. The righteous man will chasten me with mercy and reprove me; as for the oil of the sinner, let it not anoint my head. For yet more is my prayer in the presence of their pleasures; swallowed up near by the rock have their judges been. They shall hear my words, for they be sweetened; as a clod of earth is broken upon the earth, so have their bones been scattered nigh unto hades. For unto Thee, O Lord, O Lord, are mine eyes, in Thee have I hoped; take not my soul away. Keep me from the snare which they have laid for me, and from the stumbling-blocks of them that work iniquity. The sinners shall fall into their own net; I am alone until I pass by. With my voice unto the Lord have I cried, with my voice unto the Lord have I made supplication. I will pour out before Him my supplication, mine affliction before Him will I declare. When my spirit was fainting within me, then Thou knewest my paths. In this way wherein I have walked they hid for me a snare. I looked upon my right hand, and beheld, and there was none that did know me. Flight hath failed me, and there is none that watcheth out for my soul. I have cried unto Thee, O Lord; I said: Thou art my hope, my portion art Thou in the land of the living. Attend unto my supplication, for I am brought very low. Deliver me from them that persecute me, for they are stronger than I.

Tone 3 (Resurrection)

People: By Thy Cross, O Christ our Savior, death's dominion has been shattered; the devil's delusion destroyed. The race of man, being saved by faith, always offers Thee a song.

Reader: The righteous shall wait patiently for me until Thou shalt reward me.

People: All has been enlightened by Thy Resurrection, O Lord. Paradise has been opened again. All creation, praising Thee, always offers Thee a song.

Reader: Out of the depths have I cried unto Thee, O Lord; O Lord, hear my voice.

People: I glorify the power of the Father and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy Spirit: the undivided, uncreated Godhead, the consubstantial Trinity which reigns forever.

Reader: Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplication.

People: We bow down in worship before Thy precious Cross, O Christ, and we glorify and praise Thy Resurrection, for by Thy wounds we have all been healed.

Reader: If Thou shouldest mark iniquities, O Lord, O Lord, who shall stand? For with Thee there is forgiveness.

People: We praise the Savior incarnate of the Virgin, for He was crucified for our sake and resurrected on the third day, granting us great mercy.

Reader: For Thy name's sake have I patiently waited for Thee, O Lord; my soul hath waited patiently for Thy word, my soul hath hoped in the Lord.

People: Christ descended to hell proclaiming the glad tidings: "Behold! Now I have triumphed! I am the Resurrection, I will lead you out, for I have shattered the gates of death!"

Reader: From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch let Israel hope in the Lord.

People: Standing unworthily in Thy most pure house, O Christ God, we offer our evening song, crying from the depths: Thou Who didst enlighten the world, by Thy Resurrection on the third day, O Lover of man, deliver Thy people from the hand of the enemies!

Reader: For with the Lord there is mercy, and with Him is plenteous redemption; and He shall redeem Israel out of all his iniquities.

Tone 8 (from the Lenten Triodion)

People: The Lord's praises were always on thy lips, O holy Father John. With deep wisdom thou didst search the Scriptures, which teach us to deny ourselves. Thou didst become rich in the blessings of grace, overthrowing the craftiness of the devil.

Reader: O praise the Lord, all ye nations; praise Him, all ye peoples.

People: Thou didst wash thy soul in a fountain of tears, O most glorious Father John, keeping vigil for God and gaining His mercy. Upborne on the wings of prayer, thou didst fly to divine love and beauty. Now, together with thy fellow soldiers, O holy one, thou dwellest in His spiritual light and unending joy.

Reader: For He hath made His mercy to prevail over us, and the truth of the Lord abideth for ever.

People: On the wings of faith thou didst raise thy mind to God, O holy Father John. Hating the world's confusion and vanity, thou didst take up thy cross and didst follow Him Who sees all things. Thou didst submit thy rebellious flesh to His guidance, through the discipline of self-denial, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Tone 5 (from the Lenten Triodion)

Tone 3 (Resurrection)

People: Thy life-bearing Resurrection, O Lord, enlightened the whole universe,

recalling Thy creation. Delivered from Adam's curse, we sing: O Almighty

Lord, glory to Thee!

Reader: For He has established the world, which shall not be moved!

People: Thou art the changeless God, Who, suffering in the flesh, wast changed.

Creation could not endure seeing Thee on the Cross. It was filled with fear while praising Thy patience. By descending to hell and rising on the third

day, Thou hast granted to the world life and great mercy.

Reader: Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, unto length of days.

People: Thou didst endure death, O Christ, to deliver the race of man from death.

Thou didst rise from the dead on the third day, raising with thyself those
