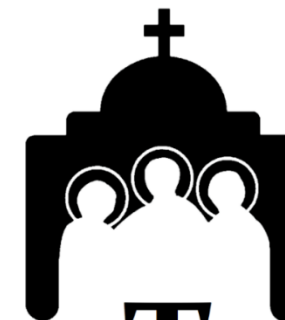

TROPARIA

Resurrection (Tone 6)

The angelic powers were at Thy tomb; the guards became as dead men. Mary stood by Thy grave, seeking Thy most pure Body. Thou didst capture hell, not being tempted by it. Thou didst come to the Virgin, granting life. O Lord who didst rise from the dead: glory to Thee.

Transfiguration (Tone 7)

Thou wast transfigured upon the mountain, O Christ our God, showing Thy glory to Thy disciples as far as they were able to bear it. At the intercessions of the Theotokos, make Thine everlasting light shine forth also upon us sinners. O Giver of light, glory to Thee.

St. Emilian the Confessor (Tone 3)

In confessing the faith thou didst proclaim Orthodox Doctrine and wert unjustly exiled for rebuking the wicked king. Righteous and glorious Emilian, the boast of Cyzicus, entreat Christ God to grant us His great mercy.

St. Emilian the Confessor (Tone 3)

The church for which thou didst suffer glorifies thee in hymns, O Emilian; thou wert a valiant champion of the Trinity, therefore we honor thy memory. Deliver thy servants from all assaults of the enemy. *Now and ever...*

Transfiguration (Tone 7)

On the mountain Thou wast transfigured, and Thy disciples beheld Thy glory, O Christ our God, as far as they were able so to do: that when they saw Thee crucified, they might know that Thy suffering was voluntary, and might proclaim unto the world that Thou art truly the Brightness of the Father.

PROKEIMENA

O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance.

O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast thou made them all.

HYMN TO THE THEOTOKOS

Instead of "It Is Truly Meet..." we sing:

Magnify, O my soul, the Lord who was transfigured on Mount Tabor! Thy childbearing was without corruption. God came forth from thy body clothed in flesh and appeared on earth and dwelt among men. Therefore, we all magnify thee, O Theotokos.
