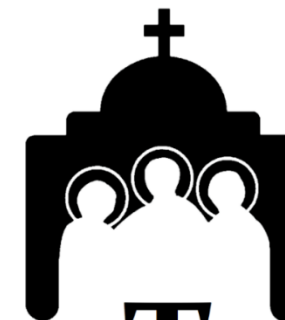

Resurrection (Tone 4)
