## TODAY'S HYMNS

### TROPARIA

#### Resurrection (Tone 7)

By Thy Cross, Thou didst destroy death! To the thief, Thou didst open paradise! For the myrrhbearers, Thou didst change weeping into joy! And Thou didst command Thy disciples, O Christ God, to proclaim that Thou art risen, granting the world great mercy.

#### Transfiguration (Tone 7)

Thou wast transfigured upon the mountain, O Christ our God, showing Thy glory to Thy disciples as far as they were able to bear it. At the intercessions of the Theotokos, make Thine everlasting light shine forth also upon us sinners. O Giver of light, glory to Thee.

#### Monk-Martyr Dometius (Tone 4)

Trained in asceticism on the mountain, with the weapon of the Cross you destroyed the spiritual assaults of the hostile powers, all-blessed one; once again you bravely prepared for combat and for both struggles you have been crowned by God, monk-martyr Dometius of eternal memory.

### KONTAKIA

#### Resurrection (Tone 7)

The dominion of death can no longer hold men captive for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its powers. Hell is bound, while the prophets rejoice and cry: the Savior has come to those in faith! Enter, you faithful, into the Resurrection. *Glory...*

### KONTAKIA (continued)

#### Monk-Martyr Dometius (Tone 6)

You rose above earthly things which drag down the mind; you were a great guide of monks, O Dometius. You did not fear the furious emperor who would not honor God. Therefore, Hieromartyr, you died singing the hymn: "God is with me and no one is against me." *Now and ever...*

#### Transfiguration (Tone 7)

On the mountain Thou wast transfigured, and Thy disciples beheld Thy glory, O Christ our God, as far as they were able so to do: that when they saw Thee crucified, they might know that Thy suffering was voluntary, and might proclaim unto the world that Thou art truly the Brightness of the Father.

### PROKEIMENA

#### Resurrection (Tone 7)

The Lord shall give strength to His people!  
The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

#### Feast (Tone 4)

O Lord, how manifold are thy works! In wisdom hast thou made them all.

## TODAY'S HYMNS (continued)

### HYMN TO THE THEOTOKOS

#### Instead of "It Is Truly Meet..." we sing:

Magnify, O my soul, the Lord who was transfigured on Mount Tabor! Thy childbearing was without corruption. God came forth from thy body clothed in flesh and appeared on earth and dwelt among men. Therefore, we all magnify thee, O Theotokos.
