TODAY'S HYMNS

TROPARIA

Resurrection (Tone 1)

When the stone had been sealed by the Jews, while the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure body, Thou didst rise on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. The powers of heaven therefore cried to Thee, O Giver of Life: "Glory to Thy Resurrection, O Christ! Glory to Thy Kingdom! Glory to Thy dispensation, O Thou Who lovest mankind!"

Dormition of the Theotokos (Tone 1)

In giving birth thou didst preserve thy virginity! In falling asleep thou didst not forsake the world, O Theotokos! Thou wast translated to life, O Mother of Life, and by thy prayers thou dost deliver our souls from death.

St. Thaddeus (Tone 3)

Holy Apostle Thaddeus, entreat the merciful God to grant our souls forgiveness of transgressions.

KONTAKIA

Resurrection (Tone 1)

As God, Thou didst rise from the tomb in glory, raising the world with Thyself. Human nature praises Thee as God, for death has vanished. Adam exults, O Master! Eve rejoices, for she is freed from bondage and cries to Thee: "Thou art the Giver of Resurrection to all, O Christ!" *Glory...*

St. Thaddeus (Tone 4)

The Church sees thee as a shining star, O Apostle Thaddeus, and is enlightened by thy wonders. Save those who honor thy memory in faith! *Now and ever...*

Dormition of the Theotokos (Tone 2)

Neither the tomb nor death could hold the Theotokos, who is constant in prayer and our firm hope in her intercessions. For being the Mother of Life, she was translated to life by the One who dwelt in her virginal womb.

PROKEIMENA

Resurrection (Tone 1)

Let Thy mercy, O Lord, be upon us as we have set our hope on Thee.

Song of the Theotokos (Tone 3)

My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.

HYMN TO THE THEOTOKOS

Instead of "It Is Truly Meet..." we sing:

The angels, as they looked upon the Dormition of the Virgin, were struck with wonder, seeing how the Virgin went up from earth to heaven! The limits of nature are overcome in thee, O Pure Virgin: for birth-giving remains virginal and life is united to death; a virgin after child-bearing and alive after death, thou dost ever save thine inheritance O Theotokos.
