A RESOURCE TO KNOW

Our Lord says "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." (*Matthew 11:28*) While a vacation can be rejuvenating in the warmer months it is important not to take a vacation from life in Christ! If you're going on a trip in the coming months consider finding a local Orthodox parish nearby where you can gather for worship and Communion. One website that can be a useful tool for this is www.assemblyofbishops.org. Select the "Directories" menu and "Parishes" page where you can search for canonical parishes within a selectable distance from a given location.

Please remember it is also good practice to reach out to the rector of the parish in advance to notify him you plan on attending services.
