

Thy net. O Lover of Man, glory to Thee!

Thou hast given him his heart's desire, and hast not withheld the request of his lips. *Troparion*

For Thou dost meet him with goodly blessings; Thou dost set a crown of fine gold upon his head. *Troparion*

Introit: Be Thou exalted, O Lord, in thy strength! We will sing and praise Thy power! *Troparion* Glory... Now and ever...

KONTAKION

Pentecost (Tone 8)

When the Most High came down and confused the tongues, He divided the nations; but when He distributed the tongues of fire, He called all to unity. Therefore, with one voice we glorify the all-holy Spirit!

HYMN OF VENERATION

Instead of "Holy God...," we sing:

As many as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ, Alleluia.

PROKEIMENON

Pentecost (Tone 8)

Their proclamation has gone out into all the earth, and their words to the ends of the universe.
