## TODAY'S HYMNS

### TROPARIA

#### Resurrection (Tone 2)

When Thou didst descend to death, O Life Immortal, Thou didst slay hell with the splendor of Thy Godhead! And when from the depths Thou didst raise the dead, all the powers of heaven cried out: O Giver of Life! Christ our God! Glory to Thee!

#### Dormition of the Theotokos (Tone 1)

In giving birth thou didst preserve thy virginity! In falling asleep thou didst not forsake the world, O Theotokos! Thou wast translated to life, O Mother of Life, and by thy prayers thou dost deliver our souls from death.

#### Prophet Samuel (Tone 2)

We celebrate the memory of Thy prophet Samuel, O Lord; through him we beseech Thee "Save our souls!"

### KONTAKIA

#### Ressurrection (Tone 2)

Hell became afraid, O almighty Savior, seeing the miracle of Thy Resurrection from the tomb! The dead arose! Creation, with Adam, beheld this and rejoiced with thee! And the world, O my Savior praises Thee forever.  
*Glory...*

#### Prophet Samuel (Tone 8)

Thou wast a precious gift given to God before thy conception. Thou didst serve Him like an angel from Thy infancy, O blessed one. Thou wast granted the charism to announce beforehand future things. Therefore, we cry to thee: "Rejoice, Samuel, Prophet of God and great high priest."

#### Dormition of the Theotokos (Tone 2)

Neither the tomb, nor death could hold the Theotokos, who is constant in prayer and our firm hope in her intercessions. For being the Mother of Life, she was translated to life by the One Who dwelt in her virginal womb.

### PROKEIMENA

#### Resurrection (Tone 2)

The Lord is my strength and my song, He has become my salvation.

#### Dormition of the Theotokos (Tone 3)

My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.

### HYMN TO THE THEOTOKOS

#### Instead of "It is Truly Meet..."

Magnify, O my soul, the Lord who was transfigured on Mount Tabor! Thy childbearing was without corruption. God came forth from thy body clothed in flesh and appeared on earth and dwelt among men. Therefore, we all magnify thee, O Theotokos!
