TROPARIA

Resurrection (Tone 2)

When Thou didst descend to death, O Life Immortal, Thou didst slay hell with the splendor of Thy Godhead! And when from the depths Thou didst raise the dead, all the powers of heaven cried out: O Giver of Life! Christ our God! Glory to Thee!

Venerable Euthymius (Tone 8)

The image of God was truly preserved in thee, O Father, for thou didst take up the Cross and follow Christ. By so doing, thou hast taught us to disregard the flesh for it passes away; but to care instead for the soul, since it is immortal. Therefore thy spirit, venerable Euthymius, rejoices with the angels.
