Dweller of the desert and angel in the body, thou wast shown to be a wonderworker, our God-bearing Father Kyriakos. Thou didst receive heavenly gifts through fasting, vigil, and prayer, healing the sick and the souls of those drawn to thee by faith. Glory to Him Who gave thee strength! Glory to Him Who granted thee a crown! Glory to Him Who through thee grants healing to all!
