TROPARION

Resurrection (Tone 1)

When the stone had been sealed by the Jews; while the soldiers were guarding Thy most pure body; Thou didst rise on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. The powers of heaven therefore cried to Thee, O Giver of Life: "Glory to Thy Resurrection, O Christ! Glory to Thy Kingdom! Glory to Thy dispensation, O Thou who lovest mankind!"

As the bountiful harvest of Thy sowing of salvation, the lands of North America offer to Thee, O Lord, all the saints who have shone in them. By their prayers keep the Church and our land in abiding peace through the Theotokos, O most Merciful One!

CANONIZATION OF ST. OLGA

On Friday, June 20, the Orthodox Church glorified Saint Olga of Kwethluk—a righteous mother, matushka, and wonderworker of Alaska. Born in 1916 to the Yup'ik people and known as Arrsamquq, "the quiet one," she lived a life of deep humility, prayer, and maternal compassion. As a priest's wife, midwife, and spiritual guide, she served her village with gentleness and strength, especially comforting women who had suffered in silence. Her memory remained powerful long after her repose in 1979, as stories of healing, visions, and answered prayers spread across Alaska and beyond. In her quiet love, the Church now recognizes a saint. Righteous Mother Olga, pray to God for us!
