TROPARION

Resurrection (Tone 2)

Martyr Julian of Tarsus (Tone 4)

Thy holy martyr Julian, O Lord, through his sufferings has received an incorruptible crown from Thee, our God. For having Thy strength, he laid low his adversaries, and shattered the powerless boldness of demons. Through his intercession, save our souls!

KONTAKION

Resurrection (Tone 1)

Hell became afraid, O almighty Savior, seeing the miracle of Thy Resurrection from the tomb! The dead arose! Creation, with Adam, beheld this and rejoiced with Thee! And the world, O my Savior, praises Thee forever.

Let us all worthily praise Julian today, the unconquerable pious warrior and seeker of truth; To him let us cry out: "Pray to Christ God for us all!"
